Richard Moe, former chief of staff for VP Walter Mondale, is co-author of [Changing Places: Rebuilding Community in the Age of Sprawl](#), a study of the causes of urban decline and the use of historic preservation as a tool for revitalization, published in 1997. In 2007, he was awarded the National Building Museums Vincent Scully Prize, which recognized his leadership in moving historic preservation into the mainstream of American life and expanding the public's understanding of the importance of protecting and celebrating our heritage. That same year he also received the American Historical Associations Theodore Roosevelt-Woodrow Wilson Award for Public Service. Moe was named an honorary member of The American Institute of Architects (AIA) in 2003.
